Art and Design at Horndon on the Hill Church of England Primary offers a high-quality art education that builds pupils' ability to 'appreciate and interpret what they observe, communicate what they think and feel, or make what they imagine and invent'.

Through our art and design curriculum, pupils develop practical knowledge of how to create art, craft and design, for example by learning the methods and techniques that artists, craft-makers and designers use. They can also build theoretical knowledge of the tools, materials and history of art, craft and design. Finally, pupils acquire disciplinary knowledge of the concept of art itself, such as the ways it is judged, valued and evaluated. Our intent is that art and design in our school is both intellectually challenging and creatively demanding. The systematic approach we take enables pupils to see, to know and to experience art, pupils learn how to view, discuss and make art.

Intent:

- Fulfil the requirements of the National Curriculum for art and design,
- Ensure the progressive development of knowledge and skills,
- Know that art can support their development in other subjects.

Implement:

- Art and design is taught as part of each topic,
- There is a focus on knowledge and skills stated in the National Curriculum,
