

Curriculum Overview

The school curriculum at Horndon on the Hill Church of England Primary is designed to promote learning and personal growth for all our pupils, regardless of their starting point, ability or specific need. We want to provide opportunities for children to grow into positive, responsible citizens by developing their skills and knowledge, whilst working and cooperating with others ensuring all our pupils are inspired for future learning and employment.

Intent:

- To provide a rich and varied curriculum, which has its roots based in our Christian school vision and Cooperative Trust values, and inspires the children to want to learn
- To promote diversity and acceptance of all, encouraging respect and a sense of community for the children with the school, the parents, the church and the wider community
- To extend learning beyond the classroom, raising awareness from the local area to national and global arenas, providing the children with an understanding of the wider world and its complex cultures

Implement:

- Through quality teaching of knowledge, skills and vocabulary across all areas of the curriculum, the children will foster a curiosity and interest, challenging them to be inquisitive, compassionate and creative learners
- Opportunities are provided for pupil voice to inform the learning for each topic, allowing for discussion to extend thinking, check understanding and identify misconceptions
- Teachers use assessment effectively to inform next steps, ensuring knowledge is gained, applied and consolidated.

Impact:

- Children achieve well and this is reflected in results at the end of each Key Stage
- All children leave our school academically, physically and spiritually developed with an established love of learning
- The children are ready for the next stage of their education, having been provided with skills, knowledge and Christian and Cooperative Trust values which they can use to further develop their independence and motivation as learners
