

Your child should have brought home a copy of the KIRFs for their year group for this half term. Please spend some time helping your child with these- little and often is the key. They are as follows:

- Year 1: I know number bonds to 10.
- Year 2: I can say the number that is one more and one less than a given number to 100.
- Year 3: I know the multiplication and division facts for the 3 and 4 times tables.
- Year 4: I know the multiplication and division facts for the 6 times table.
- Year 5: I know the multiplication and division facts for all times tables up to 12 x 12.
- Year 6: I can count up in decimals crossing boundaries and I know my decimal number bonds to 1.
